Day of Remembrance for Jarl Hakon

Jarl Hakon is one of those rare men who, by the sheer force of will changed history. Hakon was a strong practitioner of the old ways and likely an Odinn's man. After Hakon's father was burned alive by the grandsons of Harald Fairhair he vowed revenge and set about seeing that those responsible would pay dearly. Hakon was able to kill the grandson responsible and also, with



the aid of the king of Denmark, to gain the jarldom of western Norway. Immediately upon his gaining power in Norway, Hakon began rebuilding the old temples and holy sites and encouraged the worship of the Gods again undoing much of what Fairhair and his family had done for Christianity.

Eventually Hakon was called upon to come to the aid of his Danish ally against Emperor Otto II of Germany. The ensuing war did not go well for the Scandinavians and it happened that Hakon was

priest off his ship. From there he sailed to islands off the coast of Sweden and gave blot to Odinn as ravens flew overhead.

After this great omen Hakon returned to Norway and repelled the incoming invasion. Now he was able to rule in peace for some time and continue his revival of the ancestral ways unhindered by outside influences.

Men like Hakon are rare, but each of us has the ability to change our immediate surroundings or, at the very least, change our perception of those surroundings. Hakon took misfortune and turned it into fuel to drive him to achieve great things. We too have that ability, we can decide how we react to things and how we deal with things. We can rise to the occasion or we can slink off and hide in the shadows. As Asatruar I dare say the only real option for us is to rise up. Asatruar -real sons and daughters of the Gods- do not hide in the shadows or slink off anywhere! We, like Hakon, must always stand tall and proud.

Folk History

Germanic/Anglo-Saxon/Norse Law

Translated from Old Norwegian by Laurence M. Larson Professor of History, University, Illinois Being the Gulathing and Frostathing Law, regional laws of pre-Christian Norway

One of the reasons I am telling about this history is because there have been at best obfuscation and at worst intentional lies about our pagan culture. That is, the old lie that we who come from our traditional culture and religion were -in the words of the victors of this long culture war- lawless and was originally written down from the oral tradition into Latin and later transcribed to Old Norwegian. It was for the first time translated into a modern language, English, in 1935 by Professor Larsen.

Today, even with mass communication, the same old confusion as to our history finds its way into the modern dialogue. Take, for example, the common saying "the United States is a nation of laws from our Christian heritage". One of the Founders of the US Constitution, Thomas Jefferson, wrote about this subject from the 1760s through the 1820s. Jefferson in his letters wrote "the common law existed while the Anglo-Saxons were still Pagan, at a time that they never heard of Him or the word Christ pronounced". In a letter to Major John Cartwright, Jefferson argued that Christianity was not part of the common law but had been foisted into law by an act of Judicial legislation (what we call today judicial activism). Incidentally, this letter gave rise to the famous quote by Jefferson referring to a "wall of separation between Church and State".

Definitions in Germanic Law:

Ax = payment Baug = 'ring', 'armlet', 'money' Mark = approximately one pound sterling Thing = legal assembly Outlaw = a person outside the protection of the law

A Baug decreed at the Thing for the killing of a man was paid by the whole family of the killer to the family of the slain man. A "Head Baug" was paid by the father and amounts to ten marks or thirty-two cows. A "Brother Baug" is paid to the slain family and amounts to five marks or sixteen cows. A "Cousin Baug" amounted to four marks or the value of thirteen cows.

So it seems the family was held by the Thing to pay for the acts of its family members. Outlawry was also sometimes imposed by the Thing. Without family life it would be hard indeed for an outlaw.

There were many rights to fishing, grazing, and timber harvesting. Bondi or freemen had the Odal right to hold lands through the right of inheritance. The Almaning was the land held in common.



Kindred Spotlight

Iron Guard Kindred



In this month's Kindred Spotlight the AFA would like to honor and show our thanks to the Irongard Kindred of Virginia. The Irongard was founded following Winter Nights in the Poconos in 2016. Originally just meant to be a mannerbund called the Guardsmen, they morphed into a kindred community that opened up to women and children. Since then they were have grown exponentially.

Ironguard Kindred's structure is different than the traditional concepts of a kindred. It actually consists of small groups under one banner the Flag of the kindred- the Wheel Axe. Each local group is called an outpost and has an identity unto its own. They practice Asatru through a set calendar of Holy tides and perform ceremonies in a unilateral tradition that every outpost is familiar with. These Holy tides are based on their unique solar/Lunar calender called the Ironmark. The

Winternights of our ancestors. A 12-night celebration with special functions is observed throughout the Yuletide for each night coming to a culmination that ends on the secular New Year of the Julian calendar.


